2026 Service Plan



Exciting changes are planned for 2026

- The planned service updates and implementation dates are subject to change, based on resource availability.
- Only major service updates are shown here.
- Schedule adjustments may occur to other routes, to improve reliability, connections, and address customer concerns.

1 Filling gaps in existing service

In 2026, we are working on filling some of the gaps in schedules and routing across the system.

April 411 421 Saturday and Sunday • Route 421 will replace route 411 trips, so that all trips operate as Route 421.	June 302 Monday to Friday • 15 minute service will operate more consistently during morning and afternoon peak periods.
September 101 Monday to Friday • Additional trips will be introduced to extend the availability of service. 502 Monday to Friday • 502C trips will be introduced between 09:00 and 14:00, so that scheduled service operates all day to southwest Bowmanville.	Fall and winter 409 419 Saturday and Sunday • Additional trips will be added, so that service operates consistently until 22:00. 121 Saturday and Sunday • Service extended to Pickering Station, so that service operates to Pickering Station seven days a week.

2 Keeping up with growth

Durham is growing, and in 2026, DRT is planning extensions of service to new employment and residential areas, including:

- Seaton.
- North Oshawa.
- Thornton Road employment area.
- West Whitby.

June 905 Monday to Friday • Some trip will operate via the Thornton Road employment area, north of Taunton Road.	September 118 Monday to Sunday • Service will be extended to Highway 7 in Seaton. • Weekend service will be introduced, from about 07:00 to 19:00, every 30 minutes. 306 Monday to Friday • Service will be extended to Taunton Road. 423 Monday to Friday • Service will be extended to Nancy Diamond Drive.
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3 Building a more frequent and available network

We’re staying up later on main regional routes, and some neighbourhood routes. These service extensions replace On Demand during the busiest travel times in the late evening.

June 905 915 916 Monday to Sunday • Service will be extended to midnight.	September 902 917 Monday to Sunday • Service will be extended to midnight. 502 Saturday and Sunday • Service will be extended to 22:00.
Fall and winter 121 216 224 Monday to Sunday • Service will be extended to midnight.	

4 Building On Demand and connecting Durham’s northern communities

The introduction of scheduled service to new growth areas, and to new areas within Port Perry and Uxbridge, will replace some On Demand trips, in areas where demand warrants scheduled service.

April 618 • Service modified to operate via the Port Perry Hospital and the Line 6 employment area.
September 605 Monday to Friday • Pending community consultation, service will be modified to operate via northwest Uxbridge, and to Parratt Road, replacing On Demand in these areas.
